




Materials:

- something to color with if using the B&W version,
- scissors,
- glue,
- paper.
- You can use brass fasteners ("brads") instead of glue to attach the legs if you want them to be moveable.


Instructions:

- Print out the template of choice -- there is a choice of brown, grey or uncolored.
- Color (where appropriate) and cut out the template pieces.
- Glue the donkey together in the following order:
 - feet onto the bottom of the large (grey) oval
 - one front and one back on the top of the body
 - one front and one back on the bottom of the body
 - head onto the front of the body
 - tail onto the back of the body
 - mane onto the body/head
 - forward ear onto the head
 - hair onto the head
 - back ear onto the head
 - See picture on the template for further help.

Finished Craft



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

Materials:

- something to color with.
- scissors,
- glue,
- paper.
- You can use brass fasteners ("brads") instead of glue to attach the wings if you want them to be moveable.

Instructions:

- Print out the craft template.
- Cut out the template pieces. Recommend do this ahead of time and maybe put all the pieces for a rooster in a ziploc – 1 per kid
- Color the pieces – see the color samples on the template
- Glue the rooster together in the following order:
 - head onto the body
 - legs onto the body
 - tail onto the body
 - wings onto the body (one wing should be behind the body and one on top to give it a 3D effect)
 - comb onto the head
 - beak onto the head
 - See picture on the template for further help.

Rooster template



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Materials:

- printer,
- paper
- scissors.
- string, thread, ribbon or wool
- Optional: crayons (or paint, markers, etc)


Instructions:

- Print template (there is only B&W available) and color as desired.
- Cut out the template pieces (may require adult assistance and can be done before hand.
- Cut on one of the dotted line right up to the center.
- Pick out the two matching cross (this is good practice for young children!).
- Slide the cross together, top to bottom all I have is the snowflake image to show you how it's done
- Glue a ribbon or thread onto the top (or hole punch a small hole and tie a ribbon through; I used a thread and it worked really well).

Options:

- instead of simply coloring the template, here are some thoughts for Alternatives:
 - sparkles or sparkle glue

Template



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
Materials:

- Wool or ribbon
- single hole punch
- scissors
- pencil
- card stock, poster board or construction paper

Instructions:

- ADULT: print template of choice or make your own.
- ADULT: Glue onto a thick piece of cardboard (cardboard backs from paper pads or old boxes work well).
- ADULT: Cut out this template .
- Allow the children to trace the template onto a piece of card stock or poster board (or construction paper... Though I prefer the thicker card stock for lacing projects).
OR have an adult do this prior to craft time.
- Allow the children to cut out their card stock shapes
OR have an adult do this prior to craft time.
- Allow the children to make holes around their shape (about an inch or two apart)
OR have an adult do this prior to craft time.
- Provide the children with a length of wool or ribbon.
 - You can wrap some scotch tape around the end of the wool to make it more like a shoe lace.
 - Have the child thread the wool through the holes.
- Practice tying knots and/or bows to tie off in the center.
- Optional: Let the children use glitter, paint or stickers to further decorate their completed project.
